
BACKGROUND

"Tele workstations are display screen equipment workstations installed permanently by the employer in the workers' private sphere [...]" [German Workplace Ordinance 2016]

CONDITIONS TELE WORKSTATIONS

- Specification of conditions for teleworking between employer and employee before use is permitted
- Stipulated weekly working hours by the employer
- Permanently installed and equipped by the employer in the workers' private sphere

NUDGING

- Psychological approach from the field of behavioral economics
- Neither laws, rule nor prohibitions, nor financial incentives or penalties
- Making decisions without restricting freedom of choice

SAFETY CARD

- The aim is to avoid injuries and survive life-threatening situations
- In immediate vicinity of passengers
- Communication of safety-relevant knowledge primarily by clearly arranged visual language
- Standardized signs symbolizing hazards and safety related behaviour
- Logically structured and following an "if-then" logic
- Has to be adapted to the respective aircraft type and emergency equipment
